Entry into force of the Bunker Convention – Bunker Blue Cards for Mobile Offshore Units – the establishment of Safeguard Guarantee Company Ltd as security provider

Introduction

The purpose with this special circular to our mobile offshore unit ("MOU") Members is to inform them about special procedures established for the purpose of providing the financial security required for MOUs under the International Convention on Civil Liability for Bunker Oil Pollution Damage, 2001 (the "Bunker Convention").

The reason for establishing these special procedures is that the provider of financial security under the Bunker Convention will be exposed to risks, described below as Special Risks, falling outside the scope of the traditional reinsurances taken out in the commercial market for MOUs insured outside the International Group of P&I Clubs' reinsurance structure.

A new insurance and guarantee company named *Safeguard Guarantee Company Ltd* (hereinafter called "*Safeguard*") has been established in Bermuda for the sole purpose of offering the financial security required under the Bunker Convention for MOUs. Assuranceforeningen Gard – gjensidig (hereinafter called the "Club" or the "Association") will not be involved as a risk carrier for risks falling outside the scope of its traditional reinsurance program.

Background

The Bunker Convention

The Bunker Convention will enter into force on 21 November 2008 after having been ratified by the required number of States¹ with the requisite combined gross tonnage registered. The

Bunker Convention provides a liability, compensation and compulsory insurance system for the victims of oil pollution damage caused by spills of bunker oil from any seagoing vessel and seaborne craft of any type whatsoever, including MOUs. The owner will be liable to pay compensation for pollution damage (including the costs of preventive measures) caused in the territory, including the territorial sea of a State Party, as well as its exclusive economic zone or equivalent area.

Certification

Registered owners of any seagoing vessel and seaborne craft of any type whatsoever, including MOUs, over 1000 gross ton registered in a State Party, or entering or leaving a port in the territory of a State Party, or arriving at or leaving an offshore facility in the territorial sea of a State Party, will be required to maintain insurance or other financial security, which meet the requirements of the Bunker Convention and to obtain a certificate issued by a State Party attesting that such insurance or other financial security is in place. The State issued certificate must be carried on board at all times.

In order to obtain a certificate from a State Party, documentation for the required insurance or other financial security (the "Bunker Blue Card") has to be provided from an insurance company or other guarantee facility. The Bunker Blue Card has to comply with the requirements of the Bunker Convention as discussed in the previous Circulars to all Members of the Club².

Special Risks falling outside the scope of traditional reinsurance covers

The Bunker Convention exposes the issuer of a Bunker Blue Card to biochem, cyber and nuclear risks. Further, the issuer of the Bunker Blue Card will be exposed to terrorism risks for a period of up to three months even if the war risk reinsurer has invoked his right to terminate the cover with seven days notice. The risks described in this paragraph, (i.e. biochem, cyber, nuclear and terrorism) are collectively referred to as the "Special Risks".

This means in practice that if the Club were to issue Bunker Blue Cards for MOUs, the Association would be exposed to Special Risks falling outside the scope of the Club's existing reinsurance arrangements. For that reason the Club is unable to provide the Bunker Blue Cards as required under the Bunker Convention for MOUs falling outside the reinsurance organized under the International Group of P&I Clubs' Pooling Agreement.

Safeguard Guarantee Company Ltd

Purpose

In order to assist MOU Members who need to have the financial security required under the Bunker Convention in place when the new legislation enters into force on 21 November 2008 the sister association of the Club, and its principal reinsurer, Gard P. & I. (Bermuda) Ltd (hereinafter referred to as the "Bermuda Club"), has taken the initiative to establish a new insurance and guarantee company in Bermuda. The new company is named Safeguard Guarantee Company Ltd (hereinafter called "Safeguard"). The sole purpose of Safeguard is

to offer the financial security required under the Bunker Convention for MOUs and other vessels reinsured outside the International Group of P&I Clubs' reinsurance structure.

The Bermuda Club will be involved as a financial investor but not as risk carrier for risks falling outside the scope of the Club's traditional reinsurance program.

Scope of cover

As the issuer of the Bunker Blue Cards, Safeguard will be the guarantor for all categories of liabilities arising out of pollution damage caused by bunker oil on board a MOU as defined in the Bunker Convention. This will comprise liabilities caused by or arising from Special Risks as well as liabilities falling within the category Ordinary P&I Risks, as defined below. While Safeguard will be the actual risk carrier as far as liabilities caused by Special Risks are concerned, subject to terms agreed, the Association and possibly other direct insurers involved in the insurance of P&I risks for MOUs, as the case may be, will remain the *de facto* risk carriers for liabilities caused by pollution damage as described in the Bunker Convention falling within the scope of the traditional P&I cover (hereinafter called "Ordinary P&I Risks")³.

For this reason Safeguard will require that the owner of the relevant MOU has taken out traditional P&I cover on standard terms covering the liability for pollution damage caused by bunker oil under the Bunker Convention save for liabilities, losses, costs or expenses caused by or arising from Special Risk. Among other things, the MOU's P&I insurer will be required to give a separate undertaking to Safeguard pursuant to which the other insurer undertakes to indemnify Safeguard for any liabilities, losses, costs and expenses incurred by Safeguard as guarantor under the Bunker Blue Card not caused by or arising from Special Risks and to give Safeguard three months' separate notice if the cover for Ordinary P&I Risks will be terminated.

Safeguard's Terms and Conditions will be sent to Members on request and are available on www.gard.no.

Reinsurance and pricing

Firm indications have been obtained from reinsurers as to the maximum capacity available for so-called Special Risks as described above. The reinsurance cover available amounts to USD 90 million as an annual aggregate limit plus one reinstatement. The reinsurance is placed in the Lloyd's market.

The start up of Safeguard is dependent on a certain volume of business in order for the new company to be able to charge competitive premium rates. Thus, MOU Members who need or will need Bunker Blue Cards are invited to support the company. The larger volume of business Safeguard gets when its starts trading, the more competitive rates can be offered for the Special Risks and the Bunker Blue Cards. Assuming the volume of business will continue to increase Safeguard will in due course be able to reconsider its premium rating.

To summarize, Safeguard has already been incorporated and capitalized for the purpose of providing the financial security required under the Bunker Convention for MOUs and other vessels insured outside the International Group.

To comply with the Bunker Convention requirements the Blue Card will need to state the name of the MOU, the MOU's distinctive number or letters (or call sign), the port of registry, the IMO number and the name and full address of the principal place of business of the registered owner. Safeguard will insert the address of the registered office unless advised of an alternative address by the Member.

In view of the early entry into force of the Bunker Convention, it is recommended that Members start the application process as soon as possible. Contact details of all the administrations of States Parties to the Convention are provided in Annex 1.
